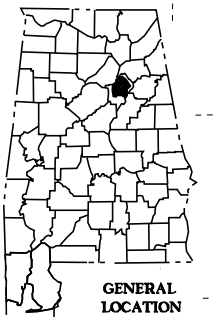


This map is your permit for use in accordance with the seasons, rules, and regulations listed hereon. This permit must be signed and in your possession to be valid.

Use Permit and Hunting Regulations –Sept. 1, 2008 – Aug. 31, 2009

PERMITS: A season permit is required for all hunting and other recreational purposes and is valid for all game species and seasons listed hereon. Season permits may be obtained locally at 231 Quick Stop, intersection of U.S. Hwy. 231 and U.S. Hwy. 411; K & N Service Station, intersection of U.S. Hwy. 231 and AL Hwy. 144; K-Mart and Wal-Mart in Pell City; Lucky's Bait and Tackle on Main Street, Pell City; 5th Avenue Grocery, Hwy. 411, Ashville; and from Conservation Enforcement Officers in St. Clair County. Permits will also be issued from the Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries Office between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Mon.-Fri., or by writing to Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries Office, 4101 AL Hwy. 21 North, Jacksonville, AL 36265 (enclose current hunting license number and stamped, self-addressed #10 envelope). Trapping permits must be obtained from Wildlife and Freshwater Fisheries Office. All deer and turkey killed on the area must be recorded on a ledger made available at Anna's Grocery and at K & N Service Station.

HUNTING DATES:

DEER:	(Gun)	Stalk Hunting Antlered Bucks Only: Mondays and Saturdays only during the State gun deer season of Nov. 22-Jan. 31. Stalk Hunting Hunter's Choice (except spotted fawns): Nov. 28-29, Dec. 12-13, and every Wednesday of the State gun deer season. Two deer per day, (only one of which may be an antlered buck).
	(Archery)	Stalk Hunting Hunters' Choice (except spotted fawns): Oct. 15-Jan. 31. Two deer per day (only one of which may be an antlered buck) except during dates of bucks only hunts. On bucks only hunt dates, one Deer (antlered buck only) per day.
TURKEY:	(Physically Disabled) (Regular)	Mar. 15 (Daylight until 1:00 p.m. CST). Mar. 16 - Apr. 30 (Daylight until 1:00 P.M. CST).
SQUIRREL:		Oct. 1-Feb. 28 (except on days of gun deer hunts).
QUAIL:		Nov. 15-Feb. 28 (except on days of gun deer hunts).
RABBIT:		Oct. 1-Feb. 28 (except on days of gun deer hunts).
RACCOON, OPOSSUM & FOX:		Oct. 1-Nov. 21 (Nighttime hours only; Fox hunting - dogs only - no weapons).
TRAPPING:		Jan. 1-Feb. 20.

BAG LIMITS: Deer/Gun – During Bucks Only Hunt Dates - One deer per day (bare antlers visible above natural hairline-no spotted fawns). On each of the bucks only gun deer hunts, those hunters less than the age of 16 and all female hunters may harvest either sex deer (except spotted fawns). Deer/Gun – During Hunters' Choice dates – Two deer per day (only one of which may be an antlered buck). Deer/Archery – 2 deer per day, only one of which may be an antlered buck, except during bucks only hunt dates. On bucks only hunt dates, the bag limit is one deer (buck only) per day. Turkey (Gobblers only) - 1 a day; 5 per season; Squirrel - 8 a day; Quail - 12 a day; Rabbit - 8 a day; Raccoon - 5 per person per day; Opossum - No Limit; Fox - none.

Falconry: Falconry will be legal on all scheduled area hunts for legally permitted falconers (must possess state and management area hunting licenses and management area permit). Falconers must adhere to bag limits and hunting season dates as listed above for resident and migratory game birds and animals (except no more than 3 migratory birds per day).

PERMITTED FIREARMS & ARCHERY:

Deer:	Stalk Hunts:	Centerfire rifles that have been plugged or otherwise incapable of holding more than 11 cartridges and using mushrooming and/or expanding type ammunition or shotguns using slugs only or muzzle loading rifles .40 caliber or larger, or centerfire handguns with a minimum 4 inch barrel length using mushrooming and/or expanding type ammunition. All applicable laws regarding possessing and carrying handguns must be followed.
Turkey:		Shotguns using No. 2 shot or smaller and archery (no crossbows).
Squirrel & Rabbit:		Shotguns using No. 4 shot or smaller, .22 caliber or smaller rimfire firearms, and muzzle loading rifles .40 caliber or smaller, or rifles operated by air.
Quail:		Shotguns using No. 4 shot or smaller.
Raccoon & Opossum:		State law and regulations apply.
Fox:		No weapons allowed.

On all scheduled hunts except fox hunting, archery will be legal. Broadhead points will be legal only during scheduled deer and turkey hunts. Archery equipment specifications must conform to State Regulations. **WHEN ARCHERY HUNTING, IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO CARRY OR POSSESS ANY FIREARMS.**

Trapping: Standard .22 caliber rimfire firearms only during daylight hours only. All trappers must conform with all state laws and regulations pertaining to trapping.

TIME FOR HUNTING AND AUTHORIZED ACTIVITIES:

Hunting and other authorized activities are restricted to daylight hours, except raccoon, opossum, and fox hunting which may be hunted at night during the season dates listed on this permit for raccoon, opossum, and fox. All other unauthorized activities are prohibited after 7:00 p.m. each day until daylight hours the following day.

IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL:

- To hunt, trap, use dogs, possess firearms, ammunition, traps, archery equipment or utilize the area for any other recreational purpose without a valid permit. A permit is valid only for authorized activities or during scheduled management and refuge area seasons during legal hunting hours and only with weapons and ammunition permitted for hunting the wildlife listed on permit.
- To use dogs for stalk hunting of deer or for turkey hunting.
- To use dogs for hunting, training or any purpose from March 1 to the opening of the following fall gun season.
- For any person under 16 years of age to hunt on the management area unless accompanied by a licensed hunter at all times.
- For any person to carry firearms in or on vehicle with ammunition in the magazine, breech or clip attached to firearms, or black powder weapons with primer, cap or flash powder in place.
- To possess alcoholic beverages while on the community hunting area at any time.
- To kill or willfully molest any species of wildlife except those designated for hunting. However, this regulation shall not apply to feral swine or coyote which may be killed during all scheduled management area hunts, during daylight hours only, when possessing a valid permit and using weapons and ammunition that are legal for such designated hunts.
- To kill or willfully molest bobcat and fox. However, bobcat and fox may be killed during all scheduled area hunts that occur during the dates of the gun deer and turkey seasons for the county or counties in which the area is located, when possessing a valid permit and using weapons and ammunition that are legal for such designated hunts during daylight hours only. One (1) fox per day may be harvested only during these scheduled area hunts.
- To discharge fireworks at any time.
- To discharge firearms for target practice.
- To hunt or discharge firearms within 150 yards of any camping area, dwelling, dam or timber operation, or within 100 yards of any paved public road, highway, or within a posted safety zone, or within one-half mile of a church on Sunday.
- To use fire to smoke out game.
- For any person except authorized personnel to operate any motor driven vehicle behind, under or around any locked gate, barricaded road or sign which prohibits vehicular traffic.
- For any unauthorized person at any time to operate a motor scooter, motorcycle, trail bike, or any motor driven vehicle on the area except on roads designated on this permit for motorized vehicular usage.
- For any person to hunt deer on days of scheduled gun, flintlock, or primitive weapons hunts without wearing a vest containing a minimum 144 square inches of hunter orange color, or either a full size hunter orange hat or cap. The hunter orange must be of solid color, except for a small logo on the front of the cap, and visible from any angle.
- For any person except authorized personnel to block or otherwise stop traffic on any road by parking a vehicle in such a way that passage around the vehicle is impossible.
- To deposit, distribute or scatter grain, salt, litter, or any other materials on management area prior to receiving approval from the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources.
- For any person to damage or remove any trees, crops or other plants, dirt, gravel or sod from management area without legal authorization.
- To erect or use a permanent tree stand or scaffold on management area without written permission from the landowners.
- To hunt from an elevated stand or platform without attaching themselves to the tree or platform with a safety harness, rope, or strap capable of supporting their weight.
- To camp overnight or have warming fires on the area.
- For any unauthorized personnel to ride ATVs or possess or ride horses on days of gun deer hunts. Riding or possession of horses shall be restricted to holders of a valid WMA license.

NOTE: Administrators of the hunt shall have the right to distribute the hunters and to inspect all vehicles or other equipment while on the areas. **The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and landowners who are making the hunting possible, hereby put each hunter on notice that he hunts at his own risk and the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources and such landowners shall not be responsible for any accidents or injuries that may occur.**

THIS MANAGEMENT AREA ESTABLISHED BY THE ALABAMA WILDLIFE AND FRESHWATER FISHERIES DIVISION IN COOPERATION WITH O.H. LAWLEY ESTATE, HANCOCK TIMBER RESOURCE GROUP, AND ALABAMA LAND AND TIMBER.

A hunting license, (or Wildlife Heritage License for small game, except waterfowl), management area permit and management area license (when hunting deer or turkey) are required when hunting on management area. This management area map/permit is required in possession for all hunting and other recreational uses of the area.
